FROM THE HEADTEACHER

It was lovely to see so many parents at Celebration worships this week, thank you for joining us. On Tuesday we were visited by a consultant from the London Diocesan Board for Schools. She was here to look at our religious education ahead of a religious focused inspection due this year and to find out what the children think about our provision; it is always helpful to get an outsider's perspective on our school.

Here are some of the things she found:

- Our curriculum is strong and consistent
- Our children ask and answer questions reflectively
- The curriculum in enriched by a breadth of opportunities such as the visits during Interfaith Week
- All that we do at St Mary's is led by our Vision which is strong and meaningful
- The children enjoy Collective Worships and can say how they relate to their lives

We await the phone call to tell us inspectors are on their way and will let you know how you can help in the process. One way you can help us prepare though is to complete Ofsted's Parentview. At my last look 41/470 families have responded. Unfortunately, this falls far below the 50% we need to look respectable please take the time to share your views, it really only takes less than 5 minutes to complete.

Young Carers

Thank you to those who have responded to the local authority's offer for Young Carers. Here is a reminder if you have a child this could relate to:

At St Mary's we are aware that some of our pupils are young carers. A young carer is someone under 18 who is caring unpaid for a family member or friend who is ill, frail, disabled or has mental health or addiction problems. They often take on practical and/or emotional caring responsibilities that would normally be expected of an adult. Research suggests there are at least 700,000 young carers in the UK but many do not realise they are a young carer. I have attached some additional information.

We know that young carers may need a little extra support to enjoy and do well at school. At St Mary's we are committed to ensuring that all pupils who are young carers are identified, and supported effectively.


