Part of my role as an EWO is to monitor persistent absentees (under 90%) and to support the school and families in improving this. I would like to remind all parents/carers that holidays should not be taken during term time as they will be marked as an unauthorised absence and will incur a Fixed Penalty Notice Fine.

All other appointments need to be made out of school hours. Alongside regular attendance, punctuality is the key to successful learning.

Please be mindful that constant lates are disruptive for all pupils and do impact the overall attendance percentages.
