National Storytelling Week

Next week it is National Storytelling Week. To promote our reading for pleasure ethos and encourage our children to read more broadly, we will end the week by running the Usborne Book Fair, on Thursday 2nd February (Infant Site) and Friday 3rd February (Middle Site). Details have been sent to you. Mr Cadman and I will enjoy reading stories to the Infant and Middle sites, whilst the junior site hears from storyteller Wendy Shearer.

Air-Up

During this week, in the true spirit of a democratic society I have listened to the alternative views of our junior pupils regarding Air-Up bottles. Through their comments in school council boxes and in their conversations had with class teachers, they have communicated their disappointment at the decision taken to ban the bottles at school.

It was unanimously agreed that we need to consider sensitively those without the bottles and reflect on the waste from the pods which cannot be recycled at school, they were able to effectively challenge the ban and put forward their opinions respectfully and confidently. They were a very persuasive group! I have heard them.

St Mary's has therefore performed a U-Turn with the following stipulations which all involved have agreed to:

- No fussing with bottles or showing them off.
- No pods to be changed during the school day - they need to take responsibility for loading their bottle before school.

If pupils break their word that individual child will be asked to keep their bottle at home. Through this process I think our pupils realise that we care about what they think and they understand that they can influence change.
