Parking

This week we have had a number of complaints regarding parking.

Infant site: Cars must not be parked on the double yellow lines outside the Arragon Road entrance. Parents are objecting to their children walking to the gate through plumes of engine fumes and having to cross between cars. The Council has been contacted and will be sending parking wardens to the site to deter parking and engine idling. There are plans to add zig zags to the immediate area to make it a safe school zone.

Middle site: A community nurse was unable to make a visit to one of our local residents as parents had parked across the drive. We try to maintain really good relationships with our neighbours but this becomes impossible when we limit access to their property with cars, please be considerate.

Junior site: Parents are using the Orleans car park at the end of our drive to park for dropoffs and pick-ups; please refrain from doing this.
