School Meals

Whilst we await confirmation of the Mayor of London's plans for free school meals for the whole school, we have, unfortunately, been notified of a rise in costs from the caterers.

As has been the case in most sectors, the cost of supplies has risen for Caterlink and they are passing the cost on to all schools in the contract. Our current financial situation does not allow us to absorb these costs so we are left with little choice but to increase the cost of meals to £2.90 per day. This is in line with the increase in the cost to the school.

This will take effect from Monday 17th April which means that the weekly cost of meals will rise to £14.50 after the Easter holidays. Should you wish to pay for the whole half term then the cost will be £81.20, and the whole term will cost £179.80.

We appreciate that the timing of this is not great as many families are experiencing ever-increasing financial commitments but, regrettably, we are left with no alternative. Please rest assured that we will keep you up to date with any changes regarding the provision of free school meals for all children.
