#### **Attendance**

With the support of our Education Welfare Officer we have successfully achieved increased attendance and decreased the percentage of lateness across the whole school. Our overall attendance from September 2021 to May 2022 was 95.5% and our overall attendance from September 2022 to today is 97.4%, an increase of 1.9%. Ultimately this means more children are in school to benefit from education for more of the time. Please remind yourself of our end of term date, Friday 21st July and our first day of school on Wednesday 6th September to avoid booking holidays in term time. # URGENT: Polio and MMR Vaccinations for Children Aged 1 to 11 in London

We all want to keep children safe and protected from serious illness, this is why we need to do everything we can to support parents across London to ensure their children are up to date with their childhood vaccinations, especially polio and MMR.

Following detections of polio virus in sewage samples in London in 2022, children aged 1-9 in London were offered an additional booster (or catch-up if not up to date) of the polio vaccine to ensure they were fully protected. Although phase 1 of this campaign enabled a large volume of vaccinations to be delivered, data from the programme highlights continuing inequities in uptake.

The additional booster dose offer has now ended. Phase 2 of the campaign will focus on under-vaccinated children aged 1-11 who are least protected and at the highest risk of becoming seriously unwell with polio as well as other preventable disease such as measles. The programme will be led by School Age Immunisation Service (SAIS) providers who have a known track record in delivering programmes to large volumes of children and reaching those in marginalised and underserved communities.

If your child has been identified as not being fully vaccinated you will receive a letter from the NHS today (via your child) asking you to complete the consent form to have the vaccination in school or at your GP's surgery. Please return this form to the school office. NHS nurses are coming into school on Friday 16th June to administer the vaccine.

## St Margaret's fair Saturday 8th July 2023

Your support (big hands and little hands) is much needed!

This year St Mary's are responsible for litter picking at the fair. If your child was a member of the plogging club at the junior site, you will appreciate the importance of this. Without our support the fair would not be allowed to proceed. As a community we are lucky to be able to use the wonderful outside space at Moormead to host the fair but it's important we respect the environment on which it will take place. We are writing to enlist your help as "litter pickers" on the day.

This cannot be done without you though so we're asking you to sign up for one of the 1hr15min slots, to grab your child/children and to pitch in for the good of the community and the school. As a result of the support each of the four local schools provide to the fair we each receive much needed funds back into the school (last year each school received £3,300 and for St Mary's this donation went directly into the creation of Willow Wood). Litter picking grabber tools will be provided on the day and as a thank you to anyone helping they will be given a voucher for a free beer/Pimm's or fruit juice.
