#### **Snacks reminder**

It is vital that snacks are checked for nuts and children do not bring to school anything that could risk life for those with allergies. Please check that your child understands the reasons for not bringing food into school in their school bags that have not been checked by you. In addition, we ask that sweets and treats are not given out at the gate. Anything you would like to share with children MUST go through their parents or the after-school staff; in this way we can continue to protect our vulnerable children.
