Parking outside the junior site

I am sorry to say that I have received a complaint from a near neighbour regarding parking outside the junior site. St Mary's parents are regularly parking on the white zigzag lines around the pedestrian crossing outside the junior site during drop-off time, around 8.45am. This is an almost daily occurrence, and it is both illegal and unsafe for our pupils who use the crossing. As a reminder, parents parking on these lines are committing an offence, contrary to section 36(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988, the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and Schedule 2 of the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988. You can be fined and lose points on your license.
