As we approach the Easter break I wanted to update you on the number of holiday requests we have received this year. 53 holiday absence requests have been received since September 2023 with a total of 349 missed sessions which equal 174.5 school days.

The only "authorised" holidays this year have been in Reception as some pupils were not yet 5 years old (statutory school age). Please remember that holidays cannot be deemed "exceptional circumstances"; in fact, the authorised holiday code has now been withdrawn from use by the Department of Education such is their commitment to reducing holidays during term time.
