# FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Cast your mind back to the summer fair and the wonderful day spent in the company of St Mary's friends and families. A fantastic £12,000 was raised of which £8,000 was profit - just incredible! Thank you for your contribution to that day and for helping us with school costs this year. # Projects

Those parents with children on the middle site will have seen the Dare to Dream Project taking shape over the last five months. The money for the projects comes from a variety of sources: FOSM (for The Pavilion), the sponsored bounce-a-thon and a huge donation from Asda (for the blue pitch) and finally from The LDBS Capital Fund (for the green trim trail groundworks and The Camp). The Capital Fund can only be spent on the middle site as it is the site we own and run.

The infant site now has a canopy in the year 1 playground and a painted football pitch with smart new goal posts. The junior site has had a revamped pond area as well as many enhancements to Willow Wood.

These projects really have transformed the spaces for our children and more importantly they keep our school competitive when attracting prospective parents. With pupil numbers on the decline, we must do all we can to sustain St Mary's for future families.

# Pick up on the playground
