Increase in short-sightedness in children

Research suggests that the global prevalence of short sightedness (myopia) is increasing. It is now twice as common as it was 50 years ago and children are becoming short-sighted at a younger age. Yet, over 20% of parents have never taken their children for an eye test. The Royal College of Optometrists recommend that to prevent short-sightedness from getting worse in children, those aged 5 to 12 should spend at least two hours a day outside, minimise screen time and when using a screen it should be no less than 30cm in front of their face. They also recommend that parents/carers access free eye tests at an optician.

Norovirus cases on the increase

Norovirus, commonly known as the 'winter vomiting bug' (although it can strike at any time of year), is a stomach bug that causes sickness and diarrhoea. Cases typically increase through autumn and into winter, but this year cases have risen earlier than usual and are expected to continue to increase. See UKHSA Agency blog.

Norovirus is able to spread easily through communities and so outbreaks are common in settings where individuals have close contact such as schools and nurseries.

Zip card applications now open

TfL have reopened applications for Zip photocards after the recent cyber attack.

You can now apply for Zip photocards for ages 5-10, 11-15 and 16+ at Free and discounted travel

TfL services will continue to accept expired aged 5-10 and 11-15 Zip photocards until 31 December 2024. After that date customers will need a valid pass.

Please make sure you apply in time as the Post Office is often busier around Christmas. The last posting date is 18 December.
