Dear Parents,

The end of another year; in my final newsletter I always try to sum up the year with some of the highlights. That isn't to say every day, week, month and term is perfect at St Mary's, but we do strive to create a happy, inspiring and fun-filled education for your child and fortunately the challenging days are few.

So, what can we look back on with pride?

Budget

It may seem odd to begin the newsletter with this paragraph but we are hugely relieved to once again report we have been able to just about balance our school budget. Schools become incredibly vulnerable when they go into the red; you may have seen the news this week about threats of school closures. Our budget position isn't because we are properly funded, far from it; it is because of you, the parents. The St Mary's Fund, FoSM events such as cake sales, fairs, quizzes and uniform sales literally keep us going - this is **not** an exaggeration. With schools all around us going into a deficit, we are so grateful to you for keeping us afloat. So, whether you work closely within FoSM, regularly donate to our St Mary's Fund, spend your money at events or contribute to all of these - thank you.

Academic Success

Last week, school performance data was published nationally for Key Stage 2 (Year 6) outcomes. Once again, we are incredibly proud of the achievements of our children and their teachers. Despite in recent years our demographic changing significantly, we have sustained the high bar we have set ourselves for some time now at St Mary's. Full results can be found on our website (and the following link) but we are pleased to share that in <u>all</u> areas (English, maths and Year 1 phonics) we were graded as 'significantly above the national average' and in most cases, performing in the 90th percentiles nationally. https://st-marys.richmond.sch.uk/school-results/

Events

Successful residentials, numerous exciting visits and visitors, sporting achievements, a stimulating curriculum that we keep tweaking to keep it current and of excellent quality, joyful class assemblies and heavenly Church Services all help to enrich your child's experience here. Our children tell us they are happy - 95% of our junior pupils (year 3-6) said they look forward to going to school and 95% of our children agree that they learn a lot at school - phew! Anything over 80% is seen as excellent results!



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Charitable Fundraising

We have raised thousands of pounds for numerous charities and school-based projects like the playground works: the year up to July was £11,822 and this academic year so far has been £3,520. Your generosity is incredible.

Attendance

With a sharp focus on attendance this year, including working closely with families and the Local Authority, we are proud to be first out of 44 Richmond schools for attendance. Being in first position was not our ambition, but ensuring children are in school as much as possible to benefit from education was. Thank you for hearing our pleas not to take holidays during term time and to get your children into school on time; it really makes a difference to your child.

Reaching beyond St Mary's

After an outstanding Ofsted inspection last year, we were determined to reach out and make a difference beyond St Mary's. Both Mr Cadman and I support the LDBS (London Diocesan Board for Schools) in various ways. Mr Cadman trains senior teachers through the NPQLT (National Professional Qualification for Lead Teachers) and I continue to be the Primary Adviser for 12 innercity schools. In addition, many of our teachers mentor Early Career Teachers (ECTs) here or are mentors for trainee teachers from both St Mary's University and the LDBS SCITT. We feel that in this way we are having an impact on the future of education as well as bringing back excellent professional development and practice to St Mary's. It is a win-win.

And even further...

This year, we are supporting Connected Planet Foundation's work in the Maasai Mara, Kenya and will be partnering with pupils at Semadep School to share stories, cultures and understand about their wildlife heritage.

It is a fantastic opportunity for us to support community-focused conservation efforts in the Mara. Any fundraising we do allows the children of Semadep School to build a connection to nature that will last a lifetime. We will keep you updated on the project as the year progresses.
