## FROM THE HEADTEACHER


#### Headteacher

## SEND system - Public consultations

The government are seeking to reform the SEND system and as a result there have been a lot of public consultations. Two important consultations close next week: the <u>Solving the SEND Crisis Inquiry</u> call for evidence (closes Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> January) and the Law Commission's <u>Review of Disabled Children's Social</u> Care (closes on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January).
